Try Something New...

Fanfare Impatiens –

The exciting news about the Simply Beautiful Fanfare Impatiens series is that they are spreaders and trailers. These Impatiens look incredible in hanging baskets and containers. Of course they are equally at home in beds and since they spread, you'll need fewer to cover the same amount of space as traditional Impatiens. They have the added bonus of handling heat better than common Impatiens.

Mystic Dahlias – These beauties are set apart from other new Dahlia varieties by their fashionable

to black foliage topped with vivid blooms. Ideal to add a lot of color to either the tropical or perennial garden border, or as a star performer in pots & planters on the patio or deck. Best in full sun.

Diamond Frost

(Euphorbia) – Heat- and drought-tolerant plants; clouds of airy white flowers all season; low maintenance.

Flambe

(Chrysocephalum) – love heat and dry conditions and flower continuously through the summer. Small round golden orange flowers cover the plants.

Sunbini (Sanvitalia) - is a

full and lush grower that is more compact than other varieties. This version of creeping Zinnia blooms even in triple-digit heat. This plant trails nicely out of pots and baskets. The 1/2 inch dark yellow orange flowers bloom all summer.

Garden Meister

(Fuchsia) - is the only Fuchsia that does well, year after year, whether in sun or shade, and alone or in combination. It always looks good and healthy. No deadheading is needed because the flowers last a very long time and it is self-cleaning.
